COMMENTS OF THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE AND SAFETY:

Mr. Titterington commented that in spite of the ice storm on Feb. 21, as workloads permit, the City is continuing picking up brush from prior storms.

AUDIENCE COMMENTS.

Scott Frank, 642 Floral Ave., Troy, on behalf of DP&L commented:

- Prior energy audit programs and rebate programs to reduce energy consumption are still in place.
- This year, DP&L will start a construction project to overhaul the electric distribution system to bring the original system up to the regular standard voltage of the rest of system. The project will include replacing over 1,000 poles. The project will start in the Westbrook area, working south and east. DP&L customers may experience a brief outage (under two hours) during this project. DP&L will provide notice prior to any outage. In response to Mrs. Baker, Mr. Frank stated that wood poles will be replaced with like poles. Mr. Harrah asked if a transformer on Dye Mill Road is to be replaced as this transformer results in a number of outages. Mr. Frank stated he would check on plans for that transformer. Mrs. Baker asked how much notice would be provided prior to an outage, and Mr. Frank stated he would provide that information. Mr. Schweser asked Mr. Frank to check on a number of bent and/or leaning poles on Drury Lane, between Ridge and Garfield Avenues.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 7:19 p.m.

SUMMARY: (to be read at Council meeting)

Committee members Schweser and Stubbs met on March 2 to consider continuing Enterprise Zone Agreement #31. On February 14, this Committee had concurred with the recommendation of the Enterprise Zone Tax Incentive Review Council (EZTIRC) that Enterprise Zone Agreement #31 with Clopay Building Products be terminated due to the lack of any tangible personal property tax benefit and the lack of any realized real property tax benefit to the Enterprise from such agreement. Representatives of Clopay have since requested that Agreement #31 be continued. They recognize that while the Agreement does not have a benefit to them at this time, that circumstance could change if there is an adjustment to the Ohio Tax Code by the State Legislature prior to the expiration date of the Agreement. The City's Enterprise Zone legal counsel has also reviewed this and advised of no issues in continuing the Agreement if the City wished to do so. This Agreement would be evaluated annually, along with all other Enterprise Zone Agreements.

RECOMMENDATION:

Noting that Clopay Building Products has requested the City to continue Enterprise Zone Agreement #31, it is the recommendation of this Committee that R-11-2011 be amended to reflect such continuation, and that the amended legislation then be adopted.

DETAILED REPORT

Committee members Schweser and Stubbs met on March 2, 2011, to consider continuing Enterprise Zone Agreement #31. Also attending the meeting were Mayor Beamish, Council President Baker, Council Member Phillips, the Director of Law, the Director of Public Service and Safety, and members of the City staff.

On February 14, this Committee had met to review the recommendations of the Enterprise Zone Tax Incentive Review Council (EZTIRC) related to the annual review of the Enterprise Zone Agreements. We had supported the recommendation that the two agreements with Clopay Building Products be terminated as one had expired and due to the lack of any tangible personal property tax benefit and the lack of any realized real property tax benefit to the Enterprise from Agreement #31. That recommendation is included as part of Resolution No. R-11-2011. Representatives of Clopay have since requested that Agreement #31 be continued, recognizing that while it does not have a benefit at this time, there is the possibility that could change should there be an adjustment to the Ohio Tax Code by the State Legislature prior to the expiration date of this Agreement. The City's Enterprise Zone legal counsel has also reviewed this and advised of no issues in continuing the Agreement if the City wished to do so. The Clopay Agreement would be evaluated annually, along with all other Enterprise Zone Agreements.

RECOMMENDATION:

Noting that Clopay Building Products has requested the City to continue Enterprise Zone Agreement #31, it is the recommendation of this Committee that R-11-2011 be amended to reflect such continuation, and that the amended legislation then be adopted. It was commented that this had been reviewed with the Committee Chair and, while he could not be present, he concurred with the recommendation.

OTHER:

As a part of the meeting, regarding the enterprise zone compensation to the Troy Schools, we were advised that as the payment to the schools is prorated based on the realized value to an Enterprise, the payment that the City will make to the schools for 2010 and for 2011 may be less than previously anticipated.

To correct this as soon as possible, we support emergency legislation.

DETAILED REPORT

Committee members Schweser and Phillips met on March 2, 2011, to review information related to a line inadvertently omitted from the Ordinance regarding Electronically Controlled Changeable Copy Signs. Also attending the meeting were Mayor Beamish, Council President Baker, the Director of Law, the Director of Public Service and Safety, and members of the City staff.

When the most recent Sign Code was adopted, the following wording related to Electronically Controlled Changeable Copy Signs, was inadvertently left out of Sections 749.13(a)(3)(H), 749.11(d)(3)(H), 749.10(d)(3)(H), and the first sentence of Section 749.11(d)(4)(A):

"Colors of Illumination shall be one color and shall be red, white or amber."

RECOMMENDATION:

So that the wording is consistent related to Electronically Controlled Changeable Copy Signs, it is the recommendation of this Committee that legislation be prepared to amend Ordinance Sections 749.13(a)(3)(H), 749.11(d)(3)(H), 749.10(d)(3)(H), and the first sentence of Section 749.11(d)(4)(A) to include that "Colors of Illumination shall be one color and shall be red, white or amber." WHEREAS, In accordance with ORC Section 5709.85 the duly appointed Tax Incentive Review Council met on February 11, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the Tax Incentive Review Council submits for City Council consideration their review of each of the Enterprise Zone Agreements,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Troy, Ohio, as follows:

SECTION I: That the Council of the City of Troy, Ohio, hereby accepts the recommendations of the Tax Incentive Review Council dated February 11, 2011 attached hereto as Exhibit A, that certain Enterprise Zone Agreements be continued.

SECTION II: That the Council of the City of Troy, Ohio, hereby accepts the recommendation of the Tax Incentive Review Council dated February 11, 2011 attached hereto as Exhibit A, that Enterprise Zone Agreement #17 be terminated.

ORDINANCE No. 0-3-2011

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 749 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF TROY, OHIO AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, City Council members recognize that signs are important to our business community.

WHEREAS, Council finds it both necessary and appropriate to amend Chapter 749 of the current Sign Code to add language regarding electronically controlled changeable copy signs; and

WHEREAS, the recent legislative updates to the sign ordinance inadvertently omitted language regulating electronically controlled changeable copy signs and this legislation is necessary to effectuate the overall purpose of the regulation of signs within the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Troy, Ohio as follows:

SECTION I: That Chapter 749.10(d)(3) of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Troy, the Sign Code, is hereby repealed.

SECTION II: That Chapter 749.10(d)(3) of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Troy, the Sign Code, as set forth below, is hereby enacted:

749.10(d)(3)

Stand Alone Electronically Controlled Copy Signs. All stand alone electronically controlled changeable copy signs shall be in accordance with the following requirements:

- A. Illumination. All electronically controlled changeable copy signs shall adhere to the illumination standards set forth in this Sign Code.
- B. Height of Message Characters. The height of each character on an electronically controlled changeable copy sign shall not exceed eighteen (18) inches.
- C. Message Display. All electronically controlled changeable copy signs shall have each message appear for no less than twenty (20) seconds.
- D. Illusion of Movement Prohibited. All electronically controlled changeable copy signs must show the entire message at one time without displaying characters that are scrolling, moving, or exhibit the illusion of movement.
- E. Maximum Area. Each square foot of sign area shall decrease the maximum allowable sign area by four (4) square feet per sign face.
- F. Scoreboards. Electronically controlled changeable copy signs are permitted on scoreboards at sports facilities.
- G. In no case shall electronically controlled changeable copy signs be greater than 50 (fifty) square feet per sign face.
- H. Colors of Illumination shall be one color and shall be red, white or amber.

SECTION III: That Chapter 749.11(d)(3) of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Troy, the Sign Code, is hereby repealed.

SECTION IV: That Chapter 749.11(d)(3) of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Troy, the Sign Code, as set forth below, is hereby enacted:

749.11(d)(3):

Stand Alone Electronically Controlled Copy Signs. All stand alone electronically controlled changeable copy signs shall be in accordance with the following requirements:

- A. Illumination. All electronically controlled changeable copy signs shall adhere to the illumination standards set forth in this Sign Code.
- B. Height of Message Characters. The height of each character on an electronically controlled changeable copy sign shall not exceed eighteen (18) inches.
- C. Message Display. All electronically controlled changeable copy signs shall have each message appear for no less than twenty (20) seconds.
- D. Illusion of Movement Prohibited. All electronically controlled changeable copy signs must show the entire message at one time without displaying characters that are scrolling, moving, or exhibit the illusion of movement.

- E. Maximum Area. Each square foot of sign area shall decrease the maximum allowable sign area by four (4) square feet per sign face.
- F. Scoreboards. Electronically controlled changeable copy signs are permitted on scoreboards at sports facilities.
- G. In no case shall electronically controlled changeable copy signs be greater than fifty (50) square feet per sign face.
- H. Colors of illumination shall be one color and shall be red, white or amber.

SECTION V: That Chapter 749.11(d)(4)A of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Troy, the Sign Code, is hereby repealed.

SECTION VI: That Chapter 749.11(d)(4)A of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Troy, the Sign Code, as set forth below, is hereby enacted:

749.11(d)(4):

- A. Illumination. Colors of illumination shall be one color and shall be red, white or amber. Undue brightness is prohibited. For the purpose of enforcing this provision, "undue brightness" will be construed to mean illumination of a white portion of the sign in excess of the intensity levels: Day: 5,000 nits, Night: 1,000 nits.

SECTION VII: That Chapter 749.13(a)(3) of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Troy, the Sign Code, is hereby repealed.

SECTION VIII: That Chapter 749.13(a)(3) of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Troy, the Sign Code, as set forth below, is hereby enacted:

749.13(a)(3):

Stand Alone Electronically Controlled Copy Signs. All electronically controlled changeable copy signs shall be in accordance with the following requirements:

- A. Illumination. All electronically controlled changeable copy signs shall adhere to the illumination standards set forth in this Sign Code.
- B. Height of Message Characters. The height of each character on an electronically controlled changeable copy sign shall not exceed eighteen (18) inches.
- C. Message Display. All electronically controlled changeable copy signs shall have each message appear for no less than twenty (20) seconds.
- D. Illusion of Movement Prohibited. All electronically controlled changeable copy signs must show the entire message at one time without displaying characters that are scrolling, moving, or exhibit the illusion of movement.
- E. Maximum Area. Each square foot of sign area shall decrease the maximum allowable sign area by four (4) square feet per sign face.
- F. Scoreboards. Electronically controlled changeable copy signs are permitted on scoreboards at sports facilities.
- G. In no case shall electronically controlled changeable copy signs be greater than 50 square feet per sign face.
- H. Colors of illumination shall be one color and shall be red, white or amber.

SECTION IX: That this Ordinance is an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of public peace, health and safety of the City of Troy, Ohio, and for further reason that the absence of such regulation could result in inconsistent regulation of electronically controlled changeable copy signs, NOW, WHEREFORE, this Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Mayor.

We are providing the following for your information:

- The bids for the following concession contracts were held on March 2 with one bid received for each:
 - ◊ Duke Park Softball Concession - received from Troy American Legion Softball for three years based on an annual payment of \$750 plus services totaling \$6,450 at the end of the three year contract, which is approximately the same as the expiring contract.
 - ◊ Little League Football Concession - received from Troy Little League Football for three years based on an annual payment of \$100, which is the same as the expiring contract.
- Employee News:
 - ◊ Jim Bowell, Firefighter, has announced his retirement effective March 16. He began his career with the City of Troy Fire Department on January 7, 1990.
 - ◊ Dean Jackson, Operator in the Waste Water Treatment Plant, has announced his retirement effective March 31. He began his career with the City of Troy in the Street Division on August 26, 1991. Mr. Jackson transferred to the Sewer Maintenance Division in April of 1992, and then transferred to the Cemetery Department in August of 1993. He then transferred to the Waste Water Treatment Plant in December of 1998.
- The Cemetery Department has commenced the annual spring cleanup of the grounds at Rosehill and Riverside Cemeteries. This includes the requirement that citizens remove wreaths, decorations and other items from the grave sites and grounds. New decorations can be placed starting April 1.

SUBJECT: Miami County Transfer Station
Tipping Fee Increase

The Miami County Commissioners are in the process of increasing the tipping fees at the Miami County Transfer Station. The tipping fee for disposal is proposed to go from \$54.30/ton to \$57.05/ton exclusive of Ohio Environmental Protection Agency fees. All rates for other services (tires, Freon removal, spill cleanup, etc.) will remain the same. The proposed rates will likely go into effect on April 1, 2011.

As part of this process, the Miami County Commissioners will be conducting three public hearings on consecutive Tuesdays in March. The hearings will be held on March 8, March 15, and March 22 at 9:15 a.m. in the Commissioner's Hearing Room located at 201 West Main Street, Troy, Oh 45373. Public comments will be received at this time. Written comments may also be submitted to the Commissioner's office delivered to the same address.

In order to minimize the tipping fee increase, the Sanitary Engineering Department completed a thorough operational review with the aid of an outside Consultant. First, overtime has been eliminated except in extreme cases where safety of customers or staff is an issue. Secondly, the Consultant, Brown and Caldwell, reviewed all aspects of the Transfer Station operation from entrance to the facility to exiting the facility. Brown and Caldwell noted that the Miami County Transfer Station "far exceeds its respective

standard of care in terms of overall maintenance and cleanliness", along with noting the excellent efficiency at which the staff performs their duties.

The Miami County Commissioners regret having to request this tipping fee increase as they are very aware of the struggles that businesses and local governments have faced and continue to face during the current economy.
